



Journeys to Justice: Ireland 2024 August 14 - 22, 2024

<u>Itinerary</u>

Day 0: Travel from Denver, CO - Wednesday, August 14

Afternoon/evening departure from Denver, CO, arriving in Dublin, Ireland in late morning/early afternoon.

Overnight: in flight

Day 1-2: Arrival & Belfast: Thursday - Friday, August 15-16

[One guide for one day; Two guides for one day, Transportation]

Arrive in Dublin and transfer to Belfast. Spend the afternoon and the following day exploring Belfast highlights, history of conflict, and examples of reconciliation:

- **Titanic Belfast Museum**, exploring the shipwards and maritime industry that shaped the city; recall the influence of a growing suffragette movement in the UK and US **Parriers and Walls** that still divide post conflict Belfast including interpreting the Peace

- **Barriers and Walls** that still divide post-conflict Belfast, including interpreting the Peace Wall graffiti and its meanings.

- Good Friday Agreement conversation about models for peacemaking and justice
- Queens University in Belfast for reflection on the Art of the Troubles

Overnights: Hotel/guesthouse near Belfast [Breakfasts and one dinner included]

Day 3: Pilgrimage Downpatrick: Saturday, August 17

[One guide; Transportation]

- **St. Patrick's Way** half day pilgrimage trail walk in Downpatrick, where the former slave built his first church in Ireland

- Skainos Village urban regeneration project and vision for a shared future

- CS Lewis Square, exploring the influences and legacy of a writer

Overnight: Hotel/guesthouse near Belfast [Breakfast, lunch and dinner included]

Day 4: Corrymeela & Causeway: Sunday, August 18

[No guide, Transportation]

Workshop with the Corrymeela community in the morning*, followed by self-guided visits to: Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge; Dunluce Castle; Giant's Causeway and Bushmills Distillery (*there may only be time for 2 of the 3 activities, depending on scheduling*).

*If Corrymeela community is not available to host, Sunday morning worship will be scheduled with an historic congregation in the vicinity of Belfast.

Overnight: Hotel/guesthouse in Derry/Londonderry [Breakfast included]

Day 5: Derry/Londonderry: Monday, August 19

[Two guides, transportation]

Begin the day at the **Derry Walls**, exploring their complex history from different perspectives. Visit the **Siege Museum**, which features exhibits covering the Siege of Derry and the associated clubs of the Apprentice Boys of Derry. Continue to the **Museum of Free Derry** and stop at **Free Derry Corner and Bloody Sunday Memorial** to explore the messages and continued significance of its **murals**. Close the day with facilitated reflection on paths to reconciliation.

Overnight: Hotel/guesthouse in Derry/Londonderry [Breakfast included]

Day 6: Road to Dublin: Tuesday, August 20

[No guide, Transportation]

Transfer to Dublin, making additional stops of spiritual significance at an abbey or monastery en route. Enjoy an evening at leisure upon arriving in Dublin.

Overnight: Hotel/guesthouse in Dublin [Breakfast included]

Day 7: The Republic: Wednesday, August 21

[One guide, Transportation]

A tour recalling "Easter Rising" explores the armed insurrection of 1916 that gave rise to a state and continues to loom large in Irish collective memory. Later, visit Trinity College to see the Book of Kells, an illuminated manuscript of the Gospels (*the campus visit may be led by students*). Gain further insight into Irish history at the **Kilmainham Gaol Museum** before heading to the **Glasnevin Cemetery** to hear stories of foundational figures in modern history. Enjoy a group dinner to wrap up your visit in Northern Ireland and Ireland.

Overnight: Hotel/guesthouse in Dublin [Breakfast and dinner included]

Day 8: Departure: Thursday, August 22

[No guide or transportation]

Transfer to the airport for your departing flights.

Overnight: N/A [Breakfast included]

Ask about possible extension including additional pilgrimage visits south of Dublin and/or around Galway and Connemara.
