Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival - Bogotá, Colombia

Arrive in Bogota and transfer to your hotel. Gather this evening for a group welcome and orientation.

Day 2: Zipaquira Salt Cathedral

Tour the majestic underground formations of the Zipaquirá Salt Cathedral and explore the surrounding town. At 180 meters below the surface, move through the largest salt-rock deposit on earth and consider the significance of this Catholic symbol of the local community. After an afternoon at leisure, enjoy a dinner experience fusing Colombia's culinary heritage with contemporary flavors. The famed Chicheria Demente restaurant reimagines traditional Colombia dishes by incorporating fresh, locally sourced ingredients with innovative cooking techniques.

Day 3: Bogotá Peace Process

Begin the day on a gastronomic Tejiendo Paz, a "Weaving Peace" tour exploring the stories of Colombia's conflict and its peace process. Dialogue with peace leaders, change makers, artists and chefs, who inspire with authentic accounts of personal and communal resilience. After lunch, visit the Banco de la República Gold Museum, which houses one of the most important collections of pre-Hispanic metallurgy in the world.

Day 4: Local Life in Bogotá

Encounter Colombia's mega-diversity through its exotic fruits at Palo Quemao, one of the most amazing farmer's markets on earth. Continue on a Breaking Borders tour, engaging in dialogue with ex-gang members on how they transformed their



neighborhood from one of the most dangerous to one of the safest in Bogota. Wind down with a dynamic music workshop, where a leading pianist, composer and percussionist guide you through Colombia's rich cultural heritage through rhythm and harmony.

Day 5: Colombian Countryside and Coffee Experience

Make your way into the countryside beyond Bogota to La Palma y El Tucan, a coffee farm nestled amongst steep mountains and dense forests. Learn about their commitment to fair trade and eco-farming as well as the local coffee-growing community. Take a guided coffee tour with a local barista, and learn the origins of the most expensive coffee in the country! Enjoy lunch against a backdrop of sweeping mountain views before returning to Bogota for dinner and an evening at leisure.

Day 6: Medellin Comuna

Transfer to the airport for a group flight to Medellin. On your way into town, visit Comuna 13, a neighborhood known now for its graffiti art, murals, and local development initiatives. Arrive at your accommodations for check in and a brief orientation to the neighborhood before an evening at leisure.

Day 7: Medellin, Pablo Who?

Hear multiple perspectives on how Medellin endured through a dark period when the cocaine boom impacted local politics, conflict, social norms and even fashion. Understand how narcotrafficking defined the community, and trace the remarkable social transformation that made Colombia internationally known. Immerse yourself in the lush beauty of Jardín Botánico de Medellín, a green oasis showcasing Colombia's rich biodiversity and tropical forests of native plant species. Enjoy a thoughtfully curated lunch at In Situ, the garden's renowned restaurant, where fresh, locally inspired flavors complement serene surroundings. After an afternoon at



leisure, enjoy a group dinner experience at the intersection of food, health, and the environment.

Day 8: Cartagena Flavors

Transfer to the airport and fly to Cartagena in the morning. Upon arrival, experience the warm embrace of Cartagena's hospitality - a captivating blend of culinary artistry, vibrant music, and historic allure. After lunch, head to the charming Getsemani neighborhood for a unique rum and chocolate tasting experience showcasing the flavors of celebrated local industries dating back to the 16th century.

Day 9: Waterways

Take a canoe trip through the lagoons of a remote fishing village just beyond Cartagena in Cienaga de la Virgen, a lesser-known gem for bird-watching and rich culture. Hear first-hand stories from local fishermen while slowly navigating the intricate natural channels formed by the mangrove forest. Wonder at this exuberant biodiversity over lunch, then join an ancestral drum workshop and jam at La Boquilla beach. Enjoy an evening at leisure.

Hotel: Cartagena (breakfast and lunch included)

Day 10: Walled City Tales

Hear awe-inspiring stories of pirate attacks and heroic feats, delving deeper into Cartagena's rich history on an extended city tour. Visit the Palace of the Inquisition, an iconic site revealing the city's colonial past through artifacts dating to the Spanish Inquisition. See an impressive clock tower and stop in the cathedral at La Plaza de Bolivar in the heart of Cartagena's historic core. Stroll colorful streets, grand plazas, and architectural gems, enjoying an afternoon at leisure to discover hidden corners of the UNESCO-recognized Old Town. Return to the hotel and prepare for an evening of group reflection, followed by a farewell dinner at Mar y Zielo.

<u>Itinerary</u>

Day 1: Cartagena to Rosario Islands

Private transfer from your hotel in Cartagena to the boat dock to board a shared speedboat¹ for a scenic ride to the Rosario or San Bernardo archipelago. Arrive at Hotel Las Islas and settle into a relaxing afternoon of island exploration at leisure.

Hotel: Las Islas Barú (breakfast included)

Day 2: Leisure and Recreation

Today is free for rest, exploration, and self-care. Take advantage of the resort's pristine beach and wellness offerings, or opt to paddle through mangrove forests to observe local marine life. Sample traditional coastal cuisine featuring fresh seafood, coconut rice, and Colombian sweets. Enjoy an afternoon massage, a guided nature walk or find a spot in the shade to journal and reflect.

Day 3: Return to Cartagena

Enjoy one final breakfast at Hotel Las Islas before boarding your shared boat back to Cartagena. Upon arrival at the pier, transfer to a local hotel or to the airport for departures.
