Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival - Cairo

Arrive at Cairo International Airport and transfer to your accommodation. Take a walking tour of the **Zamalek neighborhood** for an introduction to post-colonial Egypt and recent development trends. Enjoy a **group welcome dinner** and orientation.

Travelers arriving earlier may opt for individual transfers, pre-stay accommodations, and/or a tour of Sakkara and Memphis.

Hotel: Cairo (dinner included)

Day 2: Pyramids and Grand Egyptian Museum

Begin the day at the **Great Pyramids of Giza** (camel ride optional) before seeing the iconic **Great Sphinx**. Have **lunch at a local farm**, tour the newly opened **Grand Egyptian Museum with a local archaeology student**, then continue on a self-guided exploration of GEM's extensive artifacts and treasures. Enjoy an evening at leisure (evening activity recommendations provided).

Hotel: Cairo (breakfast and lunch included)

Day 3: Christian Cairo & Neighborhood Sustainability

Explore Coptic Cairo including the Hanging Church, the Ben Ezra Synagogue, and the Coptic Museum. Head to St. Samaan Church, then tour Manshiyat Naser with a local resident to discuss life in this "Garbage City," an underserved neighborhood where the community has taken initiative to create a sustainable economy through recycling trash. Walk through Khan Al Khalili and Al-Moez, then meet with a local journalist or NGO leader.

Day 4: Islamic Cairo, Travel to Luxor

Tour the historic **Cairo Muhammad Ali castle** and meet with an **Imam at the Al Azhar/Sultan Hassan mosque** for a discussion on local religious life. After a
lunchtime **food tour** featuring authentic Egyptian food, fly to Luxor and check in to
your accommodations. Head into town to view the **Luxor Temple** by night.

Day 5: Luxor West Bank

Traverse the West Bank, with visits to the **Valley of the Kings, Queen Hatshepsut Temple** and the **giant Colossi of Memnon,** including **Ramesses V,** the **VI tombs** and the **tomb of Tutankhamun.** Meet with **an expert archaeologist** at one of these key sites to discuss Egypt's past and present, then enjoy a home hospitality lunch and conversation with a local family. Head to a nearby **gallery** for a visit curated by a local artist or expert. Spend the evening at leisure.

Optional: Hot-air balloon ride over Luxor (\$150 per person)

Days 6-9: Sailing on a Private Nile Cruise

This morning, visit the **Karnak Temple**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the most significant and extensive religious sites in ancient Egypt. After visiting the **Luxor Temple**, board a **private Nile Cruise on board a "Dahabiya".** Derived from the Arabic word "Dahab," which means gold, it reflects historical opulence and luxury associated with these elegant sailboats dating back to the 19th century. Over the following days, cruise the Nile with stops at iconic sites including:

- The Edfu Temple the largest temple dedicated to Horus and Hathor of Dendera
- The Kom Ombo Temple a unique temple that has a 'double' design for two sets of gods built by the Ptolemies
- One of the small islands on the Nile
- The High Dam, which created Lake Nasser
- Temple of Philae, an ancient Egyptian temple complex located on Agilkia Island



dedicated to the goddess Isis.

• The Tombs of the Nobles and Elephantine Island as seen during a Felucca ride.

In the evenings, hear **local music** on a nearby Island over a BBQ Dinner and meet a **storyteller** for a performance of Egypt's long-lasting oral tradition.

<u>Morning of Day 9</u> - Depart early in the morning for an optional tour to **Abu Simbel**, accessible by a 3.5-hour drive. View the magnificent rock-cut temples that were originally carved out of the mountainside during the reign of Pharaoh Ramesses II in the 13th century BCE.

Hotel: Aswan (daily breakfast, lunch, and dinner included)

Day 10: Cairo

Visit the **Philae complex** and a nearby **Nubian village** before disembarking your cruise. Transfer to the Aswan Airport and fly to Cairo, check into your accommodation. Enjoy a **group farewell dinner** before tomorrow's departure.

Enjoy breakfast at the hotel before your departure transfer to Cairo Airport.

Itinerary:

Day 1: Start of Extension

The journey continues along the Cairo–Alexandria road with stops in **Wadi El Natrun**, once home to some 60 monasteries in the *wadi* which became a Christian sanctuary after Saint Macarius the Great retreated here in the fourth century. Wander around the gardens of the **Anba Bishoy Monastery** and observe the resident monks in their routines, then visit the church itself for expansive views over the desert. Continue to **Alexandria**, founded by Alexander the Great, and often referred to as the Pearl of the Mediterranean. Enjoy the evening at leisure.

Day 2: Alexandria

Spend the day exploring **Alexandria**, Egypt's second-largest city. Visit Pompey's Pillar and the **Catacombs of Kom El Shuqafa**, a Roman burial site dating back to the 2nd century that was discovered in 1900 when, allegedly, a donkey fell through a hole in the ground. Continue to the **Great Library of Alexandria** (now the Bibliotheca Alexandrina), believed by archaeologists to have been the site of the Library of Ptolemies some 1700 years ago. Conclude with a stop at the **Montazah Palace** and **Royal Gardens**, an impressive complex with two royal palaces built during the 19th and 20th centuries. Spend the evening by the water wandering along **The Corniche** or relaxing back at the hotel.
